

Lance has been featured in Metropolis magazine's "Next Generation" program and Architectural Record's "emerging architect" series, and he has been a Fellow of the Michael Kalil Endowment for Smart Design and a Resident of the Rockefeller Foundation's Bellagio Center. He is a former columnist with Architect magazine (2007-2010), and with Kira Gould he is co-author of Women in Green: Voices of Sustainable Design (Ecotone Publishing, 2007). His latest book, The Shape of Green: Aesthetics, Ecology, and Design (Island Press, 2012), the first to study the relationships between sustainability and beauty, has been Amazon's #1 bestseller for sustainable design. Sustainability leader John Elkington has called Lance "an inspirational guide to a future we can't wait to embrace," and Builder magazine has said that he "is on a crusade to revolutionize what it means to be sustainable."

Nadav Malin is the building industry's acknowledged go-to resource when you need thoughtful perspective on the materials and design solutions that define sustainable building practice.

As president of BuildingGreen, he oversees the company's industry-leading information

and community-building resources, including Environmental Building News, its sister publication GreenSpec, and the project certification help tool LEEDuser.

He also lends his technical expertise and vision to McGraw-HillConstruction, serving as executive editor of the award-winning GreenSource magazine.

When the LEED rating system was just starting out, Nadav was tapped to lead its new Materials and Resources Technical Advisory Group, which he chaired throughout LEED's formative years.

A long-serving member of the national LEED Faculty, he is a sought-after speaker for USGBC, AIA, and CSI events, and as a consultant to architecture firms and government agencies alike. Nadav led the team that created the U.S. Department of Energy's High Performance Buildings Database, and continues to oversee BuildingGreen's responsibility for ensuring the quality of case studies and collecting meaningful data on actual building performance. When he is not facilitating a rich conversation among design professionals, he can often be found chasing a hockey puck or a soccer ball, depending on the season.

Marija has been a LEED AP since 2008 and LEED Faculty since 2011.

She is an accredited DGNB International Auditor and the first female in Europe Commissioning Authority certified by AABCcg Associated Air Balancing Council Commissioning Group.

She has contributed to numerous international LEED projects as designer, LEED consultant, LEED process administrator and Commissioning Authority. She administrated and designed the mechanical and electrical systems for the first LEED Core and Shell certified project In Italy (Gold Level) and administrated the LEED certification process of the Vodafone Village. She also introduced the first LEED for Homes pilot projects in Europe.

Marija also develops and teaches courses for GBCI's credential maintenance program, having trained over 500 LEED professionals.

With more than 15-years experience in MEP design for commercial buildings, hospitals, cruise ships and military vessels, Marija Golubovic is founding chairman of SerbiaGBC.
